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The report summarizes the school counseling services provided at Wettengel Elementary School for the 2019-2020 school year. All students' well-being which includes their ability to regulate emotions/behavior, cope with problems, to work cooperatively with others – is key to their success in school. I work collaboratively with Team Binadu to address social-emotional needs of as many students as possible in order to support GDOE mission to "prepare students for life, promote excellence and provide support." My interventions and core curriculum aligns with the American School Counselor Association (ASCA) national standards and best practices. However, it should be noted that the ASCA recommended student: counselor ratio is 250:1, which is more than half the ratio currently in place in Wettengel Elementary School.
